Project Update:

Atomaig Piseag (formally known as the Argyll Ladies Centenary Choir) has been in existence since 2003. In preparation for the production and release of a new CD they proposed holding a residential weekend to prepare their pieces.

Brief Resume:

The members of the choir are quite spread out geographically so often find it hard to get together – so this opportunity was invaluable. These sessions were led by Gaelic conductor Raymond Bremner along with Gaelic language and singing specialist Joy Dunlop who was able to take them through the Gaelic pronunciation and sounds for their music.

This allowed them to prepare their music for their second CD and manage their back catalogue of songs.

Outcome/Aims:

The sessions enabled them to have valuable rehearsal time and they look forward to the preparation of a new CD. They have also commissioned two Gaelic songs to be arranged for them and which will be performed at forthcoming Mòds.
